MYSTIC TIES CAMPAIGN

Entering the fifth year of the Mystic Ties Campaign, we began to readjust our plans for executing capital projects to reflect the slowdown in contributions realized as a result of the pandemic. Unsure what the future of the Chapter would look like with reduced tenancy and zero alumni engagement, we maintained the Chapter House but avoided committing to any large expenditures until the cloud of uncertainty lifted.

In late summer, as the world began to reassume a familiar form, the House Company bolted into action to make up for lost time and prepare ourselves for a fully active Chapter and re-engaged alumni with hopes of resuming upgrades at 94 Prince Arthur in late 2023.

Leave it to the Alpha Deltos to make up for 2 years of donations and then some in a mere 10 minutes. After the main course at Banquet, we provided an update on the great progress that had been made pre-pandemic and reminded Brothers of what was outstanding. Before the staff finished clearing the plates, the collective group made pledges totalling \$109,000.

With this unprecedented show of support, we expedited our timeline and immediately began fully replacing all the washrooms on the second and third floor, rebuilding the dilapidated laundry room, and engaging in minor repairs and upgrades around the rest of the house.
